Going the distance for a friend

et me start by saying that I am not a runner. Despite that fact, I have always been intrigued by the idea of running 26.2 miles. I mean, if Oprah could do it, shouldn't I be able to as well? So last year I challenged myself with running the 2009 Chicago Marathon. I knew it would be a unique 18-week journey to get prepared for the physical and mental feat of running a marathon. With that in mind, I knew that I wanted a running partner who could inspire me when things got tough. Little did I know then that my running partner would be a sweet 3-year-old girl from Minnesota.

Amelia Seiwert Zigan was the daughter of a family friend. In September 2008 she was diagnosed with Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia (ALL) and underwent a year of intense chemotherapy. Her doctors and family were all optimistic with the prognosis, and she celebrated her 3rd birthday with excitement about starting preschool. But the following week, they found out that Amelia's Leukemia had returned. The treatments were agressive and Amelia endured pain that no one should experience in their lifetime.

Needless to say, Amelia's family was devastated by the news and spent time being depressed about the turn of events. But Amelia did not let them wallow in negativity for too long. Despite having to wear a back brace, Amelia grabbed her Grandpa and said "Come on Papa, let's dance." So dance they did! Amelia's spirit energized the entire family and pretty soon everyone was up dancing. I knew immediately that I wanted to help her.

I had been involved with Betterment on a national and local level in Chicago for five years. In that time, I always felt so

energized from the joy and goodwill that comes from personally helping our grateful recipients. Amelia and her family were perfect Betterment recipients, and she was the exact partner that I needed to get to that finish line.

During months of waking up before
5:00 a.m. on Saturdays to run 12,
16, or 20 miles, it was stories of Amelia
dancing that I held onto tightly. I chose my
challenge, but Amelia and her family had no choice but to face theirs. If
they could continue to smile and endure, then I could too.

The generosity of all of the people who contributed money during my marathon fundraising was another source of motivation for me. Through

their support of my run, I was able to raise over \$5,000 for Amelia's family to help alleviate the financial stress that comes with the emotional roller-coaster of caring for a child who is ill.

I am happy to report that I finished my marathon with a smile. However, it saddens me to share that Amelia passed away on December 31, 2009.

Now, as I train for my next Chicago marathon, I think of Amelia and her family's strength and courage throughout their ordeal. If they can get through what they have experienced and continue to face each day and find time to give back, then another 26.2 miles is the least I can do.

She has not only spearheaded numerous events in Chicago, but was the first to begin this very personal way of fundraising for Betterment recipients. She was also one of our first 'Friends of Betterment,' a group of generous individuals who have committed to sharing \$200 a year for the next five years to support the foundation's efforts.

Catching up with our recipients...

Their needs are all different, but there is a common thread in the varied stories of each of Betterment's 144 recipients. They all possess a generous spirit that drives them to continually give to their communities even in their own time of need. In Betterment's eyes they are heroes, and in our 10 years we have helped 81 individuals and 63 organizations continue their heroic efforts of kindness. Here are just a few updates from our tremendous group of recipients.

Riding to recovery

Betterment national board member and former recipient Becky Bentley introduced us all to 7-year-old Olivia Loper in 2008. At the time, Olivia was struggling with complications as a result of a 2005 surgery to remove a brain tumor from her spinal cord and cerebellum. Her health issues were numerous, including hydrocephalus, requiring the placement of a shunt; a cerebellar mutism, disallowing her to speak for five months; deafness in one ear; the inability to walk on her own; and nystagmus, which made her cross-eyed.

Betterment chose Olivia as one of the recipients for its "D.C. Casino Night." Funds from the event were used to offset the costs of a vision therapy program, as well as weekly horse riding lessons through the Northern Virginia Therapeutic Riding Program (NVTRP).

Her parents, Jim and Amy Loper, tell Betterment, "Horseback riding has been a wonderful opportunity for Olivia to learn a new skill and is a big part of her continuing recovery. Olivia's motor skills and coordination have improved, in part, due to the riding lessons."

What's more, Olivia participated in NVRTP's annual riding show last year and was awarded two ribbons! Congratulations, Olivia!

Cleveland's 1st recipient is movin' right along

Rachel Dorocak was just seven months old when she became paralyzed from the effects of Transverse Myelitis (TM). And in 2004, at age 5, she became the Cleveland Chapter's first recipient at their inaugural spring event where funds supported her special therapy equipment not covered under insurance.

Rachel's family epitomized Betterment's ripple effect because her brothers (then ages four and six) created the "Reading for Rachel" program which has now raised over \$51,000 for TM research.



Today, Rachel is 11.5 and going into 6th grade. Though she uses a power assist wheel chair to "keep up with her friends," not much has slowed her down. She has been a football cheerleader for two years (pictured in center), active in school student council and safety patrol, and recently earned her bronze star in Girl Scouts. She spends her summers in programs through Youth Challenge, another Betterment recipient organization that works with disabled youth in Cleveland.

Rachel still undergoes extensive therapy once a week and her next big surgery will be a spinal fusion to help correct a severe spinal curve. She also participates in therapeutic riding lessons that have not only been critical to her physical development, but her emotional growth as well.

"No matter what life threw our way, we have always felt blessed," said Rachel's mom Cathy. "Blessed by the people we've met, and how our children have learned to see people for who they are."

Normal Moments recognized nationally

After Patricia Fragan's only daughter passed away at age 16, she was determined to fulfill her daughter's wish of creating an organization that would provide services for families with critically ill children. Tricia founded Normal Moments (NM) in 2008, and our Chicago Chapter's Halloween party raised funds to help NM provide their cleaning, lawncare and meal services to families. Since then, Tricia and NM were finalists in Martha Stewart's 'Dreamers into Doers' contest! Her appearance



on the show sparked viewer interest across the country, and in June, NM launched their first chapter in Wilmington, DE to serve families in the greater Philadelphia area. In Chicago, NM serves over 170 families with help from more than 75 volunteers, as well as professional snow removal companies, lawn services, and cleaning crews. They have also forged partnerships with other nonprofits like Miracles from Mia to provide financial assistance to deserving families, and Icing Smiles to give birthday cakes for ill children. Normal Moments' successes have earned them recognition in numerous Chicago publications, and in September they will be featured in Parents' Magazine!

Keeping a life-long volunteer volunteering

"The work that all of you do is wonderful. I wish that I could think of a stronger phrase than 'thank-you,' because it just doesn't adequately express the depth of my emotion and gratitude."

These words were written by Nancy Temple, one of four 2010 Cleveland Black & White Ball recipients, who recently suffered a near-fatal car accident, leaving her in chronic pain and discomfort. She has also been diagnosed with thyroid cancer and diabetes. In 2008, her husband was also the victim of a serious car accident, leaving Nancy as the sole caregiver and provider for the family. Nancy is a 27-year volunteer and long-time member of the Board of Trustees for WomenSafe, a domestic violence shelter in Chardon. Proving that she emulates the "ripple effect," Nancy has helped raise thousands of dollars for WomenSafe including the funding for a state-of-the-art resource center called "The Green House." Betterment's gift helped offset Nancy's household expenses that have been mounting due to her husband's accident, and allowed her to devote more time and resources to WomenSafe, a cause that matters so much to her.

The donation from Betterment assisted Danny and his family with the payment of his mortgage as he continues to recover and is unable to work.
